

The City enrolls part-time employees in the Public Agency Retirement System (PARS) or the California Public Employees' Retirement system (CalPERS) and currently matches the employee's contribution. Enrollment in the Gardena Municipal Employees' Association (GMEA) is required based on number of hours worked.

IMMIGRATION REFORM & CONTROL ACT OF 1986: In compliance with the Immigration Reform & Control Act of 1986, all new employees must verify identity and entitlement to work in the United States by providing required documentation.

Located just 13 miles south of metropolitan Los Angeles in the South Bay area of Los Angeles County, Gardena is strategically located near the intersection of the Harbor (110), San Diego (405) and Gardena (91) Freeways. Gardena is a General Law City, incorporated in 1930, and operates under the Council-Manager form of government with five City Council Members elected at large. Other elected officials are a City Clerk and a part-time City Treasurer. The City encompasses 5.95 square miles with an ethnically diverse population of approximately 58,000. Gardena, the "All-America City," is an active and progressive residential and business community with a City government that prides itself in providing a full range of qualified services to the community such as Police, Public Works, Administrative Services, Transportation, Community Development and Recreation & Human Services.
